SEDGEWICK SCOOP

New Property Tax Bylaw Passed

On December 4, 2008, Town Council passed Bylaw # 459—the Tax Payment, Non-Payment, Prepayment and Penalty Bylaw.

Some of the important sections in this bylaw are:

1. Taxes may be prepaid at any time until levy of the 2009 tax.
2. The discount previously received for early payment has been discontinued as of this bylaw—no discount will be given for tax prepayment in 2009.
3. Taxes may be paid on a monthly basis. The monthly budget amount must start in January of any given year. There will be no allowances for beginning a monthly payment schedule at any other time of year.
4. Should you wish to pay your taxes on a monthly basis you MUST call the Town of office prior to January 30, 2009.
5. Property Taxes are now due on the last banking day of JULY (July 31, 2009)

Important Safety Notice We have received several reports about roof top sewer vents
freezing over due to the extremely cold weather. This is a Health Hazard. Ensure that your base-
ment drains have water in them—if not, pour water down the drains. If you still smell sewer gases, have
your roof vent checked (do not do this yourself unless qualified). A plumber should be able to do this
for you. If the snow keeps covering your vent; you may need to extend your vent to 1 ft above the
roofline. CFA approved heat tapes are also available that can be wrapped around the roof vent.
