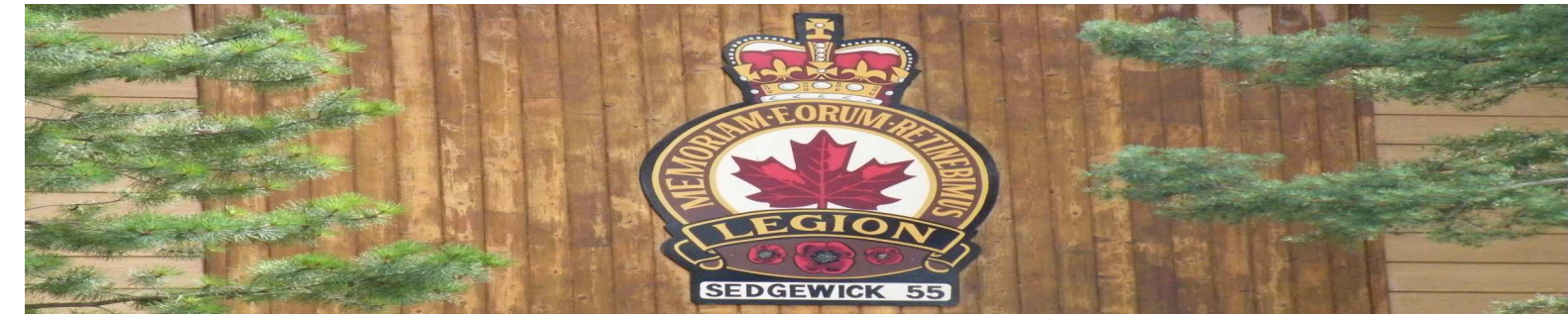

Council Meeting Highlights – August 18, 2011

- Council amended the speed limit on Mackenzie Drive from 50 km/h to 30 km/h. Enforcement of the new speed limit will commence **immediately**.
- Council approved a new Hawkers & Peddlers Bylaw #484. Check it out at www.sedgewick.ca/Services and Information/Bylaw library/Bylaw #484.
- Council awarded the Sedgewick Arena Roof Project to **Western Weather Protector Ltd.** from Calgary in the amount of **\$188,070**. Wade Engineering Ltd. will be overseeing the project work. This project will correct a design flaw of the original roof structure. The project will be funded by the **Federal Gas Tax Fund** and the **Municipal Sustainability Initiative Program** grants.
- Council approved the tender package for the asbestos abatement and demolition of the old grocery store.

Recreation & Culture in Sedgewick

The Town of Sedgewick has a large selection of Recreational activities for every season:

Sedgewick Recreation Centre offers curling (4 lanes), Bowling (4 lanes - can be rented for parties); Hockey (ice) arena and several meeting rooms (for community events, dance, reunions, etc.) The Recreation Centre is also surrounded by beautiful ball diamonds as well as the Sedgewick Agricultural Society race track and the Central High Rams' football field.

The Sedgewick & District Public Library is located within the Rec Centre (with free computer/internet services, online library books and library resources ordering and, provide home delivery of books for the housebound.)

Sedgewick Lake Park offers fully serviced sites (water, power and sewer), free showers, coin laundromat, wading pool (free to campers, charge for non-campers), playground, camp kitchen, firewood (charge), horse shoes and a concession at the Park Manager's office.

Sedgewick Golf Club operates a beautiful nine-hole golf course with a newly renovated clubhouse (in 2011) and a fully stocked pro shop. During the golf season the kitchen serves a weekday lunch special that is open to everyone.

What does the Town of Sedgewick contribute to Recreation & Culture?

- An annual operating grant of \$100,000 is provided to the Sedgewick Recreation Board for annual Rec Centre operations; the Town also assumes the water costs at the Rec Centre budgeted at \$2,500 annually and pays insurance costs of \$25,000. The Town annually budgets \$10,000 to a Recreation Capital Reserve for future requirements. In 2011 the Town is providing funds for the 'Recreation Roof Repairation Project' budgeted at \$220,000 to reconstruct a section of the roof due to a design flaw.
The Sedgewick Golf Club received a \$25,000 MSI Operating Grant in 2011.
The Sedgewick Library Board receive a \$6,350 operating & a \$6,210 library resources grant per annum. In 2011 \$5,000 MSI Operating grant was allocated to the Library.
The Sedgewick Community Hall Board receives \$4,000 per annum in operating grant funding and received a \$4,500 Municipal Capital Grant in 2010 for hall renovations.
The Sedgewick Historical Society received a \$3,000 MSI Operating Grant in 2010.

What do Volunteers contribute to Recreation & Culture in Sedgewick?

- The Town of Sedgewick has immense respect for all the volunteer board members and all of their hard work operating the many recreation and cultural opportunities within Sedgewick.
The countless hours that volunteers put into these Boards contribute hugely to the community and the way of life in Sedgewick. Users especially benefit as they can enjoy the many recreational opportunities afforded by volunteers' generous contributions of their expertise, equipment, time and in many instances, money.
The Town benefits immeasurably both financially and developmentally from the generosity of the volunteers. Without volunteers the Town would either be financially incapable of providing all the required staffing and therefore some activities would have to come to a close or, would have to increase fees and/or taxes to support the activities. This would deter economic development in the municipality due to reduced recreation services and increased taxpayer costs.

What Can You Do?

- Participate in the recreational/cultural activities offered in the community.
Provide positive feedback to the volunteers to show them that their contributions are appreciated.
Provide constructive feedback to volunteers to help them improve services.
Watch for announcements of Board vacancies and consider becoming a member.
Seek out a recreation/cultural service of interest to you and find out how you could contribute.

Municipal Land Lease

Sedgewick Town Council has addressed the issue of the unkempt appearance of town-owned vacant property. The Town Public Works Department takes pride in their ability to maintain the town's parks and lands so that they present a well-maintained appearance to residents and visitors alike and compliment the neighbourhoods they are located in.

If there are privately-owned recreational vehicles and various automobiles parked on town-owned lands, there are several issues that arise from an unauthorized use of Town lands:

- 1. Public Works cannot mow within several feet of the personal property that is parked on the town land due to liability issues. There are concerns that the private property could be damaged by flying debris or an inadvertent collision.
2. With the private vehicles on town-owned lots, the tall grass around the vehicle area cannot be mowed, which gives the area an unkempt appearance.
3. There is an environmental concern that there could be some leakage of fluids from a private vehicle onto the land that is for sale.
4. The parking of vehicles on the town-owned lots gives the appearance that the lots are occupied and in use and are not for sale.

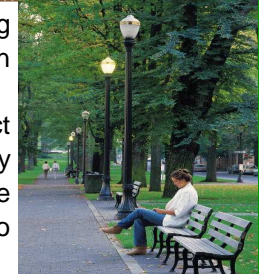
In order to address these issues, and provide local residents an option, Town Council adopted a Municipal Lot Lease Policy. This policy will permit an individual to use a town-owned lot with requirements for certain lot maintenance and public liability provisions. A copy of a Municipal Lot Lease Agreement is available to interested individuals.

All residents with private property parked on town-owned lands must either enter into a Municipal Lot Lease Agreement or remove their private property from the town-owned lands immediately or enforcement actions will be taken.

NOTE: R.V. parking is not permitted on streets between Nov. 1 to April 30 annually. (ALL TRAILERS PARKED ON THE STREET MUST BE HOOKED UP TO A VEHICLE AT ALL TIMES)

Residents are reminded that the regulations of Traffic Bylaw #440 must be complied with in regards to parking recreational and non-registered vehicles on public roads.
